# **Contract Negotiations on the Horizon**

As our current contract with New York State nears its expiration, UUP President Fred Kowal has initiated preparations for the forthcoming negotiation with Governor Hochul. During our Spring UUP Delegate Assembly (DA) in Albany on April 3, 2025, he unveiled the roster of newly appointed Negotiation Team members from across the State University of New York (SUNY) to represent the interests of our entire union membership.

It is an honor and a privilege to be selected as a member of the UUP Negotiations Team, entrusted with the development of our next Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA). The team's primary objective is to negotiate a fair and advantageous CBA that addresses the concerns and priorities of our union members, including wages, benefits, working conditions, and so on.

My selection is a direct consequence of the legacy of the UUP Farmingdale chapter. Since the establishment of UUP, over five decades ago, our chapter has consistently demonstrated disciplined union leadership. This has earned us a reputation of exceptional contribution, and a long record of past and present union leadership. Farmingdale has set a high standard in advocating for workers' rights and benefits that are still enjoyed in many contractual agreements. Joining the next team of CBA negotiators presents a significant

opportunity for UUPF members to actively participate in this transformative journey.

The task of securing an effective CBA is not a solitary endeavor. The final outcome will impact all our lives, as well as family members who rely on our benefits. To this end, the UUP will conduct a survey to gauge the sentiments of all members and gain a deeper understanding of the significance of the terms and conditions of employment, benefits, and issues that are pertinent to your local campuses. Member responses to the survey significantly influences the topics discussed during for negotiation. I strongly encourage all members to participate in the survey.

# **VOTE-COPE**

As you are aware, union dues cannot be utilized for advocacy. The Vote Cope fund is established to help UUP reach legislators. Our advocacy budget cannot compete with those of the private sector whose objectives diverge from the union's interests. Now more than ever, UUP needs the support of each and every member. 100% membership contribution means more than the dollar amount received!

Exhibit A: The SAVE Act aims to limit voting rights for millions of Americans, particularly poor and female voters. The House passed this bill with the help of four Democrats: Jared Golden (Maine), Marie Gluesenkamp Perez (Washington), Henry Cuellar (Texas) and Ed Case (Hawaii). This is why UUP/NYSUT trains us to see past lapel pins and respond to actions taken! Feel free to reach out to these folks directly, and give them a piece of your mind.

# **Contract Raises**

There is a lot of information going out about negotiations for our next contract, but there are still a few things to look forward to in this one. Keep an eye out this summer for:

- 3% 7/1 or 9/1/25 (depending on obligation)
- → 7-year award to \$1,000 on base (if you haven't already received it)
- Second award of \$800 on base for those who previously received the 7-year award, at completion of 12 years of

- service effective beginning July 1, 2025.
- ◆ Salary minimums for Professional SL 1-3s, and for Instructor, Lecturer, and Asst. Professor ranks increase \$2000 for calendar year obligations; \$1,667 for academic year obligations. Individual employees will receive either the new minimum or an ATB increase (whichever generates a higher salary for them).
- Per course salary minimum for part-time academic faculty: \$4,500
- ◆ Location Pay: 7/1/25—\$4000
- ◆ Lump Sum Bonus: Full-time employees will receive \$1500 on July 1, 2025

Note: These raises were brought to you by UUP!!!! Not SUNY or campus management. Try to remember that when you question what your dues are for.

# **Individual Development Award Program**

As a reminder, the application period for the Joint UUP/New York State Individual Development Award Program (IDAP) is open. Applications will be accepted through **May 15, 2025**. Awards will be made for the period between **July 2, 2024 – July 1, 2025**.

As a reminder, the IDAP is intended to assist eligible employees to develop their full professional potential and to prepare for advancement. Funding may be provided to enhance teaching, research capabilities, professional knowledge, and skills. Please consult the <u>Program Guidelines</u> and application instructions to ensure that your application meets program requirements.

To be considered for an award, please submit the following via the <u>IDAP Application Submission link</u>. A fully completed <u>application form</u> that includes a budget summary (refer to the college <u>travel webpage</u> for per diem and mileage rates) and all supporting documents.

- A description of the proposed project or activity including:
- Type of event, event site, and sponsor.
- Whether the employee is presenting a paper or formally participating. If presenting a paper, the title of the paper and nature of the presentation must be provided.
- A letter of acceptance of the paper being presented or other proposal. If acceptance is pending, the Campus Professional Development Committee should be notified of its receipt as soon as possible.
- How this project or activity will further the employee's professional development or otherwise assist in preparing for advancement.
- An updated brief curriculum vitae.
- Any relevant documents regarding the activity, and documentation on projected costs.
- For activities that have already taken place, please include copies of receipts and expenses.

Applications missing required documentation will be rejected. For further information, please contact the Joint Labor Management Confidential Staff committee via email at <u>FarmIDAP@farmingdale.edu</u>. Applications will be accepted until May 15, 2025.

# **National Stop the Chaos Rally**












April 19, 2025 — A few thousand Long I

# **FSC's Ward Hall**

# is Named after Hilda Jeanette Ward

Elizabeth Kortright Monroe was covered in the March 2025 "Unifier" issue. Part 2 of "Women's History Month" focuses on Hilda Jeanette Ward (November 12, 1878-July 23, 1950). Information for this essay was extracted from the Farmingdale State College archives. These documents reveal that Ward Hall is named after her. Hilda was born in Annapolis, Maryland at the United States Naval Academy where her father was stationed. She came from a long line of U.S. military officers including her father. Rear Admiral Aaron Raymond Ward (1851-1918). Hilda's mother was Anne Willis (1854-1926). Hilda had five siblings: Irwin Franklin, Annie Edna, Frederick, Aaron Raymond, and Constance Marguerite.

Hilda studied with renowned artist and teacher Robert Henri (1865-1929). Writing in *The* Craftsman (May 1910 issue), Henri lauded much praise upon her painting, "The Tenant's Dogs." Hilda's paintings were exhibited at the prestigious Art Institute of Chicago as well as the New York Armory Show (1913). This ground-breaking New York City exhibit, fully named the "International Exhibition of Modern Art," was organized by the Association of American Painters and Sculptors. It was the first major exhibition of what has been deemed the "Coming of Modern Art in America." Art critic and historian Milton Wolf

Brown (1911-1998), of the Joseph H. Hirshhorn Foundation, included her painting, "The Kennels," in his monograph, *The Story of the Armory Show* (1963).

Hilda strongly advocated for women's rights. She authored a book about women, driving, and automobile maintenance called *The Girl and the Motor* (1908). In 1918, Hilda enrolled as a student in what was then named the New York State School of Agriculture on Long Island. (After several name changes over the decades, the campus was officially titled Farmingdale State College in 1993). Based on her adoration and painting of dogs and other animals, she may have majored in Animal Husbandry (though this is an assumption, no academic major is stated in the FSC archives). What is stated in these documents, however, is that she deeply valued FSC. Upon graduation in 1920, Hilda became a large-scale financial donor to the College and served as a member of its Board of Trustees, a position she held for nearly three decades through the late 1940s.

Ms. Ward passed away on July 23, 1950 at the age of 71 and is interred at Green-Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn, New York. In 1962, Farmingdale State College posthumously honored her by renaming its Dorm 1 as **Ward Hall**.

Personal Note: Since the mid -1980s, I have been in Ward Hall for more than a hundred meetings







of all sorts. I am heartened that it was named after Hilda Jeanette Ward, a key FSC financial supporter and long-time Board of Trustees member. Thanks, Hilda for helping make our College a shining gem in the statewide SUNY System. ◆


